Judea and Samaria is the Israeli name for the disputed territory in the West Bank between Israel and Jordan.

The territory is divided into three zones:

- A fully under the administration by the Palestinian Authority
- B under a mixed Israeli-Palestinian control
- C under the Israeli control (currently about 380 000 Israelis and 150 000 Palestinians in the area C)

While the Palestinian Authority territories – areas A and B, and the Gaza Strip have a **duty-free** access to the European Union markets, people living in the area C of Judea and Samaria must pay high **tariffs** to export goods to the European Union.

Friends of Judea and Samaria is an informal working group in the European Parliament consisting of members from various political groups and political parties.



The aim is to:

- stop funding of Palestinian terrorism from the European Union budget
- abolish trade barriers of the European Union imposed on Jewish goods from the West Bank (Judea and Samaria)

Money taken from Europeans and send to Palestinian Authority is used or misused to support terrorist attacks on Jews as the Commission is not able to control where the money ends.

Regarding trade, a different approach towards Jewish and Palestinian products is applied. While Palestinian goods are free from tariffs and quotas, Jewish goods are subject to high tariffs. We seek elimination of trade barriers on Jewish goods and their labelling.
